
FROM THE RE DESK

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

- Helps to build relationships across our Catholic school community.


Who can be a member?

You represent the interests of all the partners within our school and work positively in the service of our Catholic school community.

The Catholic School Advisory Council is there to support the Principal in their leadership of the school, especially in strategy and finance.

Be part of the current and future planning of the school.	Share your unique skills in support of the Principal, guiding the current and future planning of the school.	While day-to-day operations are in the hands of school leaders, your input is invaluable at the strategic level; your expertise can help our school enhance its future planning.
Provide membership, at the Principal's request, on selection panels for the employment of staff.	Represent the community on selection panels for employing school leaders.	One member of the Advisory Council can be invited by the Principal to participate in a selection panel, where appropriate.
Communicate about the Catholic school and about Catholic education to persons and organisations in the school community.	As a representative of our school you may be invited by the Principal to support and promote the school within our local community.	Our school is an important member of the local community and is often invited to attend local government events. There may be times when the Principal will invite you to attend and represent the school community.
\$ Endorse the Catholic school's annual budget. Advise the Principal on school financial matters such as performance against budget, sustainability, and capital and recurrent planning.	The Advisory Council has oversight to confirm the proposed budget meets the school's needs. CEWA Accountants and Deloitte Australia have oversight of the financial operations of the school.	In reviewing the annual budget, the Advisory Council discusses: • Does this budget reflect the expected enrolments? • Does this budget plan for future operations? • What is the impact of these changes on our school community?
