### THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Dear Parents, Teachers and Friends,

During our Lenten period, we are called to repent, perhaps not fashionable language today, however this was one of Jesus' main messages to his disciples.

One of the best known stories told by Jesus, is of the wayward son who ends up in a pigpen with nothing to eat but the mush the pigs were fed. He begins to regret the self-will that led him to where he is. No doubt there is a great deal of self-pity mixed with his remorse. Nevertheless, he decides to eat "humble pie" and to return home. When he does, his father who has been waiting for this moment for a long time, runs to meet him and throws a party. The returning Prodigal Son does not earn his father's love by his repentance. Love has never been absent from his father's heart; only he could not experience it in a faraway country. Repentance is not the means whereby we earn God's forgiveness and love; these are there all the time. Repentance is the means by which we receive them. It is going home.






### FROM THE HEAD OF SECONDARY






