Dear Parents, Teachers and Friends,

Ready for a little poetry? Probably, you will be able to guess the age of the poet.

"A dad is a person who is loving and kind, And often he knows what you have on your mind. He's someone who listens, suggests and defends. A dad can be one of your very best friends."

Children who can write poetry like this are saying that they feel that they really matter and are important in the lives of their fathers. A father can do a lot for a child but it is the emotional bond that the child feels, that their dad is really there for them and that their welfare and progress socially, intellectually and emotionally really matter to their dad.

However, being a dad entails knowing when to shift gear and move into a role that is appropriate to the development of our child. Mark Twain's witty observation has some advice to offer: "When I was a boy of 14, my father was so ignorant I could hardly stand to have him around. When I got to 21, I was astonished at how much he had learned in 7 years."

Oxford University's "Tomorrow's Men Project" surveyed more than 1500 boys between the ages of 13 - 19 and proved the importance of the role of a father. More than 90% of boys who felt that their fathers spent time with them and took an interest in their progress, emerged in the 'can do' category. By contrast 72% of those who felt that their fathers rarely or never did these things, fell into the group with the lowest self-esteem and confidence and exhibited behavioural problems.

There is much truth in the observation that 'A man's garden and his children, both reflect the amount of nurturing done during the growing season'.

So, how about some more of that poem.

"Thank you, dad, for listening and caring For giving and sharing, but especially for just being you. Happy Father's Day!"

READ: 1st part of Pope Francis' letter for the 2023 Season of Creation (below)



**REFLECTION:** What is God's desire? Pope Francis begins this Season of Creation by getting immediately to the heart of the matter: **God wants justice to reign.** Equating the kingdom of God to right relationship with God, humanity and nature, Francis makes clear that such righteousness, authentic justice and peace, is like a nourishing stream that does not fail.

As we prepare to begin this annual Season, let us reflect on the ways in which we contribute to the stream and "let justice and peace flow". And, for a thorough ecological examen: how do some of our perceptions inhibit such a flow? From where did we imbibe these "dam-Ing" perceptions? Let us live at the heart of the matter this Season of Creation and beyond.

**ACTION:** The Season of Creation begins September 1 and continues through October 4. Procure and keep a Season of Creation journal. You may wish to play with the water imagery of this year's theme. Like a stream that flows with new water, may this Season be one of new commitment for you.


